# **How Do I Get Help?**

Your income must meet Volunteer Lawyers Project income requirements.

### **Call Ahead**

To see if you qualify before coming to the clinic, call (513) 946-9440.

Help is available on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### LIMITS ON SERVICE

The Custody and Companionship Clinic may not be able to help you if:

- The demand is too high on a certain day
- The volunteer lawyer thinks your case is too complicated for the clinic
- The volunteer lawyer has a conflict of interest.
- You are a parent in an open court case involving abuse or neglect
- You already have a lawyer
- Your case is in another county
- The Clinic does not help with Child Support.

## What is Companionship?

Companionship is a new word in the law for "visitation." It means the right to spend time with a child when you don't have custody of the child.

Representing yourself is not right for everyone. The help you receive at the Clinic is not a substitute for the full services of a lawyer. Help is provided only during Clinic hours. No Clinic volunteer will appear with you in court.

# What Kind of Help Can I Get at the Clinic?

- Learn about the law that applies to your case
- Which papers to file to ask for what you want
- Which forms to use and how to fill them out
- How to file the forms
- The next steps in your case
- What happens in the courtroom
- How to get the information or evidence you need for your court hearings
- Court programs to settle your case without having to go to trial
- Putting any agreement on paper and finishing up your case
- Resources for free or low-cost legal help if you need the full services of a lawyer
- Brief private meetings with a lawyer to get legal advice about your particular case.

### What to Bring with You

- Current ID (such as driver's license, state ID, or passport)
- Birth certificates for the children
- Court orders for any cases involving the children
- Death certificates
- Social Security numbers for all parties, including children and parents
- Names and addresses of all parties
- Proof of income
